Jeffrey Kaczorowski, a pediatrician and Professor of Pediatrics at the University of Rochester, has long been making the argument that 90 percent of a child's brain development occurs before they are five years old. However, as The Children's Agenda of Rochester has repeatedly pointed out, our state and our nation invest 90 percent of their spending on programs that involve students that are five years old and older. In other words, we are spending most of our money at a point when it does less good, than if that same money were to be spent on that same child just two or three years earlier... [read more](#)

March 1 is national Day of Empathy in which millions of Americans march to generate empathy for those impacted by the criminal justice system.

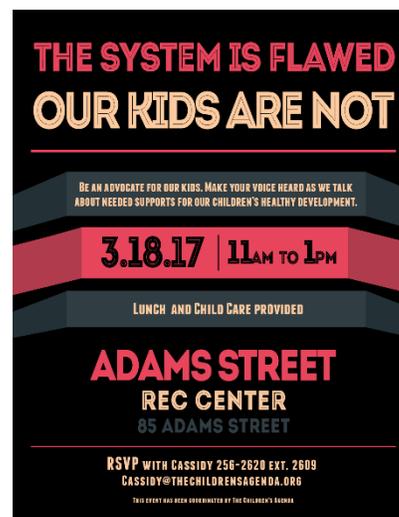
